

Chairperson – Craft Northern Ireland

Craft Northern Ireland is seeking to appoint a new Chairperson to lead the Board in our strategy to develop and promote the work of the many talented makers in Northern Ireland's contemporary craft sector. We are seeking a Chair who will bring knowledge, experience and networks to the role for the benefit of the organisation and the sector as a whole.

This is a non-remunerated role.

About Craft NI

Craft NI's mission is to contribute to an integrated, entrepreneurial and vibrant contemporary crafts sector in Northern Ireland, actively supported by regional and local stakeholders, that contributes increasingly to the creative, cultural and economic life of Northern Ireland.

The organisation is based in Belfast city centre in premises accommodating office space, gallery and retail with an exhibition space.

The organisation employs four full-time and four part-time staff over a range of areas including: maker support, digital development of the sector, communications and marketing and sector promotion. The organisation also earns income from the sale of contemporary Northern Irish craft and hosts exhibitions in its Gallery in Belfast. The Gallery team comprises a Gallery Manager and three part-time Gallery Assistants.

The organisation was established in 2004 as a development body for the craft sector and in 2017 the organisation merged with Craft & Design Collective combining retail sales and earned income with sector development functions. The Arts Council of Northern Ireland is Craft NI's principal funder, and the organisation also earns income through the sale of craft in its Belfast gallery, with approximately 50 Northern Irish makers selling work through the Gallery. Craft NI also receives funding from Belfast City Council and is seeking to diversify income streams further as one of its strategic aims. The organisation had a turnover of approximately £250,000 in 2021/22.

Craft NI's offices and Gallery are in Belfast City Centre but it supports craft makers across Northern Ireland. It seeks to develop partnerships with a range of stakeholders in local government, arts, tourism and all others, as appropriate, with an interest in a flourishing craft sector in Northern Ireland.

Time commitment

Board meetings are held between 6 and 8 times per year, usually in person. Additionally, the Chairperson will be expected to have regular meetings with the Director and to represent the organisation at meetings and events with key stakeholders from time to time. Meetings will take place in Belfast city centre.

Craft NI currently has a Board of nine members, representing a range of skills including professional craft makers, academic, curating, HR, finance and marketing. Board Committees include:

- Audit and Risk chaired by Treasurer
- Nomination and Remuneration





- Quality Group responsible for exhibitions and quality standards in the organisation
- Internationalisation
