

Results Summary

- 144 pieces of coverage, exceeding targets by 7%
- 56 pieces of NI coverage, **exceeding targets by 4%**
- 88 pieces of ROI coverage, exceeding targets by 10%
- 17 broadcast pieces of coverage. However, last year we had only 13 interviews, have a 31% increase from last year.
- 46 print pieces of coverage, exceeding targets by 2%.





'My workshops would be printing, natural dying, block printing...'

A Co Down-based artist is working on carrying on Ireland's linen heritage, as she tells Tara Moyes

uth Osborne, professionally known as Ruth Osborne Art, creates various pieces of art all using Irish linen as the base of her work. This comes after developing an interest from her education in art history.

"Tve always done my own print-making and so it was just really an evolution of developing my interest in printmaking but also working in arts education and learning more about the textile heritage that we have in Northern Ireland, particularly in Irish linen," she says.

"That kind of evolved into me now working with more natural materials alongside print and Irish linen.

"Most of what I make is textile artworks that could be framed or be wall hangings or that could be little vessels. I also then do a small selection of reproduction prints and cards which are based on my original textile works."

Belfast in particular has a long history of linen, once being called a Linenopolis in the 19th and 20th centuries. Upholding this heritage through the use of Irish linen has become fundamental in Ruth's work.

"That heritage is really important to why I work with Irish linen, and I think there are so many people with family connecting them, no matter where I go there's someone connecting them to the Irish linen industry. So that sort of sense of heritage and sense of place that linen has is really important to my work." There is the factor of sustainability and being

environmentally friendly that is important to Ruth. "In terms of linen as a textile, it's a natural and

⁻In terms of linen as a textile, it's a natural an plant-based material and it's very sustainable and very environmentally friendly in how it's produced.

"All of that's quite important, I want to think in a more sustainable way, and I want to create in a more sustainable way. I only work with linen that I've sourced from Irish guild linen members, so it's about making sure the linen is authentically designated as Irish linen." As well as the artistic factors and benefits of

using the material.

"The linen holds colour in print and texture in such an amazing way. Although I do make work with paper and on other fabrics, the linen is where I find that the textures and colours that I want to work with come through in a way which captures my imagination and sort of fulfils what I want to create.

Along with working with the environment and nature, a lot of Ruth's artworks are heavily inspired by nature itself: "I'm mostly inspired by nature and the changing seasons, but I'm not always trying to reflect an exact season. "It might just be a mood or a feeling connec ed with a season or a place, so it doesn't neces sarily have to be a literal interpretation. It can be about separating the small details or trans tions with colours that can come with the sea sons in my work."

She adds: "I try to connect it back to folklore and meaning so I'm quite invested in the sym bolic meaning behind plants and trees, and I bring some of that folklore into how the work should be interpreted.

"I do take a lot of inspiration from locations and don't necessarily create a literal represen tion of a location, but I'll take inspiration from its colours and the landscape to create a piece I'm working more with natural colours, like dyes that I make myself from foraged plants.] feel like it's quite site and land responsive." For Ruth, her most popular item varies from audience to audience, saying that her Irish lir en works that are framed, would be the most

popular commission request.

"Although I have made more retail-focused pieces, like Irish linen candle holders, which are very popular when I do artisan craft markets. What's popular sort of depends on the market and whether it's for an exhibition or more retail-focused work.

Ruth has been an independent artist since t beginning, creating her pieces from her hom studio. "All my work is original aside from the greetings cards I reproduce. All the work is made by me as a maker. It's pretty much my c ative process and my research and experime tation that then leads to the final piece, it's nc something I have other people involved with.

Outside of her home studio, Ruth has variou workshops all across Northern Ireland. "I have one strand of workshops that I delive and they'd be well-being-focused.

Key Learnings for Discussion



- **Micro release:** Going out with a micro release at the beginning of the campaign ensured that we put August Craft Month on the calendar for publications across NI and ROI and could achieve coverage from the longer lead titles.
- **Tailored regional releases:** Focusing on a release for each county ensured that we got an effective spread of coverage across the island. This was the main driver for coverage for this campaign.
- **Maker pitching:** Involving our content team allowed us to discover and build out the most newsworthy stories from the makers. This allowed us to really achieve an increase of broadcast coverage for this year.
- **Key messages:** Our confirmed key messages formed the basis of our briefing documents for broadcast interviews as per previous years. We feel this works well as a guide for speaking notes for the makers, and we can tweak this overall template also.
- **Confirming timelines**: We know that timings are key for achieving coverage throughout August. While we feel that starting in July allowed to increase coverage during the campaign, we do think a tighter planning at the end of the campaign can ensure we reach every KPI for the campaign.







- **PR Photocalls:** Both photocalls were key to driving coverage and ensuring that the campaign launch and August launch were very effective in providing a boost of coverage on a national level.
- **Thought leadership:** We thought that a thought leadership could be really effective as a final push for the campaign, ensuring we met KPIs and driving those final pieces of broadcast coverage. Next year it would be great to have this planned as priority at the end of the campaign to ensure it can go out in a timely manner.
- **Broadcast interviews:** We began conversations with broadcast media earlier this year and were able to effectively plan some slots in advance. We did achieve an increase from last year, however we did find it difficult to organise a series of interviews on the same station as they couldn't always plan their schedules so far in advance.
- Listicles: The listicles provided an effective push for the last two weeks of the campaign. Similar to previous years, we focused on specific regions across NI and ROI and used this as way to exceed our KPIs.
- **Cork Craft Month:** We found in our conversations with media that we had the same targets as Cork Craft Month and therefore found that some of our key targets wouldn't accept our content as they had already ran Cork Craft's Months pitch.





Learnings for Next Year's Growth

- Social Media Strategy: For August Craft Month 2025, we recommend exploring what we can build on from a social media and influencer perspective. This would allow a focus on channels beyond traditional PR and ensure more targeting towards specific social audiences.
- Campaign Spokesperson: Working with an ambassador / spokesperson for August Craft Month that has a strong social presence would help to support the wider social media strategy. Someone with a broadcast background would be especially effective for PR pitching for national online and broadcast opportunities.
- The Changing Media Landscape: We know that the media landscape is always changing and, while we can't predict what it will look like next year, we can ensure that August Craft Month is aligned to the content we know that media will look for to reach their audiences. This could be through a focus on video, interviews, etc and we can continue to have conversations with media to ensure all content is fully aligned.
